REACT (Reconciliation, Education and Community Training) as an organisation is now in its tenth year of operation throughout the city of Armagh. The organisation originally worked with ex-prisoners and their families but as time has moved on, so has the progression and direction of the organisation itself.

In 2002, EPIC Mid Ulster was rebranded to become REACT, and focused more on addressing community needs through reconciliation and community relations work, community based education, youth development and training. The core of the organisation is now aimed at developing whole communities with an emphasis on reaching out to those most marginalised whilst also encouraging diversity.

REACT, as an organisation, is continuing to rise to the challenges of dealing with contentious issues by encouraging those affected by the legacy of the conflict to move forward through community dialogue and participation in development programmes. This helps promote peace building and reconciliation not only within the City of Armagh but also further afield.

We will also be celebrating our 10th anniversary in March with the local community and other statutory and voluntary bodies.

The Summer Splash, funded by Armagh Community Safety Partnership on the theme of addressing anti-social behaviour. Activities included a team building residential with the young men, the PSNI and Fire Service, exploring anti-sectarianism and anti-racism among young people. We

visited both the PSNI and Fire stations in Armagh, carried out a community cleanup in the Folly and Orange-field estates.

The Summer Intervention was funded by the SELB Youth Service grant. Attendance was excellent and the young people enjoyed archery, zip wires, zorbing, film making and much more.

The community relations programme responds to a wide variety of issues that affect relationships within and between communities. This can be anything from neighbour disputes, bonfires, flags to providing opportunities for people from different communities to come together and learn about each others history, culture and identity.

Our current programme provides support to the Armagh

Bands Forum which includes the organising of a training programme between September and March each year.

Our cross community project Armagh Together in conjunction with the Armagh Unemployed Group has seen over forty people participate in various
